FROM PASTOR'S DESK

"Epiphany: The Forgotten Feast Day"

The secular world has done a very successful job of stealing Christian holidays. Christmas is no longer about the Gospel of Jesus' birth, but the law of Santa Claus looking to see if you've been naughty or nice and giving you presents under the tree. Easter is no longer about the resurrection of Jesus, but the easter bunny giving you candy and having you hunt for eggs. Advent has been a recent target, with the selling of Advent calendars that have nothing to do with the coming Christ, but are simply a countdown to secular Christmas.

But there's one feast day that the world has stolen by complete accident. When I say the date January 6th, what comes to your mind? I wouldn't be surprised if your responses are along the lines of "capital", "riot", "Trump", etc. This is what January 6th is now famous for in many American households. But January 6th has been celebrated by Christians over the past 1800+ years for something far more significant, the Feast of Epiphany.

Traditions around Epiphany vary between the Eastern and Western traditions, so I will focus largely on the Western tradition in this article. The Feast of Epiphany centers in on the visitation of the Magi (Greek for "Wise Men"), who were men from the east (probably the Persia/Babylon area) who studied astrology, dreams, and magic. They saw the miraculous star appear and came to Jerusalem to see this new King of Israel. After being led to Jesus by the star, they worship him with three gifts: gold, frankincense, and myrrh. There is a lot to say about Epiphany, but we will limit this article to two of them.

First, Epiphany means "to manifest". Throughout the season of Epiphany, who Jesus is will be "made manifest" before us (think of the hymn we sing "Songs of Thankfulness and Praise" which ends each stanza with "God in man made manifest."). We see this begin at the three gifts given by the Magi. Gold signifies that Jesus is a King. Frankincense points to Jesus being not just a man, but God himself in the flesh. Myrrh foreshadows Jesus' death and burial, the reason for his birth. These gifts begin to show you who this Jesus is and why he was born.

Second, the feast day of Epiphany has been celebrated as the first inclusion of the Gentiles into the Church. These Magi were not Jewish and, therefore, not part of Israel's covenant. However, they come and worship Jesus as their God and King. We see a glimpse of what is now quite common, Gentiles worshiping Jesus and being welcomed into the body of Christ. Rev. Weedon says it well in his book, *Celebrating The Saints*, "For the Christ Child is King of all people, not just God's ancient people! He is God come in the flesh to battle the enemies of the entire human race. The sacrifice He will offer is in exchange for every human. When the Magi kneel before Him in worship, they are but the very first of countless non-Jews who will fall before Him century after century."

The real significance of January 6th has nothing to do with the capital or Donald Trump, but has everything to do with Jesus, the visitation of the Magi, and the fact that God became a man to save all people, Jews and Gentiles alike. Let's make Epiphany great again by remembering and celebrating this wonderful feast day!
