FROM PASTOR'S DESK

"How Do We Pray?"

In Luke 11, the disciples say to Jesus, "Lord, teach us to pray, as John taught his disciples." Jesus then proceeds to give them the most famous prayer known to man, the Lord's Prayer. It is the perfect prayer, one that we pray every service before Communion, and one that you should be praying at least once a day. But there is another resource for prayer that is often neglected: the Psalms.

The Psalms are the prayers of the saints in the Old Testament and were prayed by the saints in the New Testament and beyond. Jesus even prays the Psalms while He is dying on the cross (go read Psalm 22). The Psalms are full of wonderful prayers of all different types and styles. From praising God for his blessings to crying out to God for deliverance, there is a Psalm for pretty much every situation. Let's look at two.

First, we'll look at a Psalm of praise. These types of Psalms are exactly what they sound like, a prayer praising God for what He has done for the psalmist. Let's look at Psalm 138:

¹I give you thanks, O Lord, with my whole heart; before the gods I sing your praise;

²I bow down toward Your holy temple and give thanks to Your name for Your steadfast love and Your faithfulness, for You have exalted above all things Your name and Your word.

³On the day I called, You answered me; my strength of soul You increased.

The psalmist praises God for His steadfast love and faithfulness, something that all the world should praise God for. This can be a great prayer for you to pray when you are thankful for all that God has done for you. And this Psalm has a wonderful line in verse 6 confessing God's mercy:

⁶For though the Lord is high, He regards the lowly, but the haughty He knows from afar.

Though God is the almighty Creator of the universe, He hears your prayers and desires to answer them. He wants to provide for you and does so abundantly throughout your life. Certainly, something to remember, especially when we get into the next type of Psalm.

Second, we'll look at a Psalm of lament. These types of Psalms are for those times in life where nothing is going right, everything is against you, and it seems like perhaps God isn't around like He promised He would be. Let's look at Psalm 31:

¹In You, O Lord, do I take refuge; let me never be put to shame; in Your righteousness deliver me!

²Incline Your ear to me; rescue me speedily! Be a rock of refuge for me, a strong fortress to save me!

It starts off with a cry to God, that He would be a refuge for us in our time of trouble. It is a cry of faith to God, praying that He would rescue the faithful. We see that kind of crying for deliverance continue in verses 9-10:

¹⁰For my life is spent with sorrow, and my years with sighing; my strength fails because of my iniquity, and my bones waste away.

The cry, "Be gracious to me, O Lord," is a cry of faith; an acknowledgment that God has the power to bring me out of this trouble. We see this faith especially in verses 14-15:

Even in the midst of hardships and great evil, the psalmist knows that he is in God's hands. God alone has the power to deliver him and, therefore, he places his trust in the Lord. These types of prayers are great to pray when you are in the midst of those difficult times in your life. Yes, it may be difficult, but God is always with you.

There are 150 Psalms and they are all worth praying. When you don't really know what to say when praying or have trouble coming up with the right words, the Psalms are an excellent resource for your prayer life. I would highly recommend you start praying one or a few Psalms every day. As you get more familiar with them, you'll find some that speak directly to situations you're in and they can be a great source of comfort to you. So, next time you're wondering what to pray, crack open that Bible, flip to the middle, and start praying the Psalms.

Recipes

For those of you who enjoyed the fudge and cookies at Pastor's Open House, Emma was gracious enough to share two of her delicious recipes!

FUDGE:

Ingredients:

- 4 C semi sweet Chocolate chips
- 2 cans (14oz.) sweetened condensed milk
- 2 tsp Vanilla extract
- ½ tsp Salt

Directions:

- *Prepare an 8" square pan with parchment paper, leaving
- Extra around the sides.
- *In a large heavy saucepan, add Choc. Chips and milk
- *Heat over low heat, stirring constantly until chips are almost completely melted
- *Remove from heat and stir until chocolate is smooth and creamy
- *Add salt and vanilla, stir until combined.
- *Spread evenly into prepared pan.
- *Chill for 2-3 hours or until well set.
- *Lift fudge from pan using parchment paper.
- *Cut into squares
- *Store in an air tight container

RUM LOGS:

Ingredients:

- 1 C butter
- 2 tsp vanilla
- 2 tsp rum extract
- 34 C sugar
- 1 egg
- 3C. Flour
- 1 tsp nutmeg

Frosting:

- 1/3 C butter
- 1 tsp vanilla
- 2 tsp rum extract
- 2 C confectioners' sugar
- 2Tbsp Light cream

Directions:

Cream butter, sugar and extracts. Add egg and mix. Add sifted flour and nutmeg. Shape into $\frac{1}{2}$ inch round logs then cut into 3-inch pieces. Bake at 350 degrees for 10-12 minutes.

When cool, frost and sprinkle with nutmeg.
